# THIS MONTH'S MEETING APRIL 15!!

NOTE THE DATE CHANGE! THE APRIL MEETING IS ON APRIL 15, THE THIRD WEDNESDAY OF FOR THE MONTH. The date change is due to a scheduling conflict with other activities at the Extension Office.

For April we have a guest speaker, Nile Dusdieker of North Liberty, Iowa. Nile and his wife, Lois, are retired physicians. They have been growing orchids for more than 25 years in their greenhouse. They have a daughter who lives in Australia, so they have made a number of trips to that continent and have studied the orchids to be found there. Nile is an orchid judge at the Chicago Judging Center and active in the Eastern Iowa Orchid Society.

Nile's topic for the meeting (selected by GOOS members at the March meeting) is on Australian Dendrobiums. And after Nile piques your curiosity about the Down Under Dendrobiums, we will have some available for you to add to your collection. We have purchased a nice

selection from Sunset Valley Orchids, Fred Clarke of SVO gave us a great deal and we will be selling them at cost - \$12.00 each.

Looking ahead to May, the program is still a bit sketchy, but Jim Pyrzynski will have an update on Cypripediums and some more seedlings to distribute to members interested in taking the plunge. Few members, if any, had success with the C. reginae seedlings so this year we will try C. parviflorum var, makasin seedlings. These are very similar in the requirements to C. candidum which is found in Nebraska.

#### KANSAS CITY HERE WE COME

They plan to have thousands of plants for sale – annual, perennials, herbs, tropicals, ornamental grasses, succulents and more.

We will need volunteers to staff the booth during the event. The hours for the event are Friday evening from 4:30 to 7 pm and Saturday and Sunday from 9 am to 5 pm. One advantage is that by volunteering you get into the Gardens free of charge (a \$10 savings). This gives you a opportunity also to do some plant shopping too. #### **SHOW RECAP**

Our Twenty-Eighth annual is history – and it made history. The host for our shows, Lauritzen Gardens reported that 4,649 people visited the Gardens the weekend of the show and of those 2,523 held Garden memberships. Granted some of those who visited the Gardens that weekend may not have made it into orchid, visiting the conservatory

and Leggo exhibit instead. But the crowds rarely let up in our show, even on Sunday, and that would point to the show as being a significant drawing card.

There were a number of AOS Awarded plants at the show. Their photographs are on pages 3 and 4. The show income for the Society was good too, a preliminary financial report is on page6 (the figures do not show a couple of expenses and taxes.

Next year's show is scheduled for March 5 - 6. Time to start making plans now.

#### SOME INFO FROM FRED CLARKE ON AUSSIE DENDROBIUMS

Fred Clarke of Sunset Valley Orchids (the source for the plants that will be available for purchase at the April meeting) gave the following information on Australian Dendrobiums on his website (http://www.sunsetvalleyorchids.com/htm/offerings other orchids.html). "Australian Dendrobiums are bred with species that originate in Australia. The Aussies have done an amazing job in the breeding of their native Dens and have made significant improvements; they are very popular in Australia. Here in the USA we rarely see the advanced hybrids for sale. We do see D. kingianum, and anyone who grows it knows how robust they are. The Aussie Dendrobiums are all very hardy. They do well with hot summers (75-95 deg. days) and cool winters (40-55 deg. nights). I have been trialing them all over the USA and have had customers report good successes in Florida, Virginia, New York, Michigan, Oklahoma, and California. The flowers are fragrant and will fill the growing area with a wonderful aroma. Most importantly they reflower from the old pseudobulbs, which allows for an outstanding floral display. I have seen plants produce 12 inflorescences from a single bulb over a 5 year period; now THAT is a nice feature! This re-flowering characteristic makes for plants that form beautiful specimens in a relatively short period of time.

Sunset Valley Orchids is the leading hybridizer of Aussie Dens in the USA. We have been sourcing plant material for many years and have developed a superior collection of breeding stock. This season we have been focused on breeding yellow flowers with red markings, a highly desirable color form."
