**BYF - ORCHIDS** 

One of the popular summertime TV features is a homegrown Nebraska program that's been on the air for over 60 seasons - Backyard Farmer. For those unfamiliar with it, it airs on Tuesday evenings, 7 PM – 8 PM. Viewers send in their questions, plant samples, photos, etc. about plant problems and the panel of experts try to ascertain the problem and provide advice.

But I've yet to see someone send in an orchid question to the panel. If you're a GOOS member, we have our own group of experts – our members - who have grown a wide variety of orchids for many years and who can provide advice on what to do or not to do. Additionally we have another resource – our library which contains many books and periodicals on growing orchids.

For August we'll try our own hand at "backyard farming – orchids." Members are encouraged to bring their culture questions, photos and samples of problem plants (if your plant has some disease or pest, please bag it so the problem doesn't spread), etc. and we'll try to determine what would be the best course of action.

### Sam Tsui, Orchid Inn, IL (http://www.orchidinnusa.com/)

Sam began growing orchids in the early 1980's. After trying many types of orchids, he became a serious Paphiopedilum grower in 1985. In 1990, he began hybridizing with Paphiopedilums and continues that work today. As he became more involved with Paphiopedilums, he started selling commercially in 1995 as the Orchid Inn. He grew orchids in his basement and greenhouses attached to his house. As the business grew, in 2004, he purchased six acres of property and built his first commercial 6,000 square feet greenhouse. Currently he makes over 300 crosses, produces 4,000 to 5,000 flasks or approximately 100.000 seedlings annually.

In the past 18 years, Sam has been very active in the orchid world by traveling to shows, promoting sales, and lecturing. Sam currently fills orders from around the world and attends over 20 orchid shows/conferences a year. He also does approximately 25 Paphiopedilum programs/lectures to orchid conferences, societies and groups annually in the USA, Canada, Japan, Australia and Europe. Over the past 18 years, he has judged at the Japan Grand Prix, the world's largest orchid show.

Sam will bring plants to sell. He will also accept pre-order until one week prior to the Speaker Day, and will offer at least 10% pre-order discount, except for NET price items, package and divisions.

Sam's topics will be "Paphiopedilum sanderianum Breeding and Culture" and "The Wonderful World of Parvisepalums and Their Culture".

### James Rose, Cal-Orchids, CA (http://www.calorchid.com/)

James Rose and his wife Lauris are the owners of Cal-Orchid. In the early 1970's the Roses began their orchid careers in the commercial realm, and eventually purchased their own nursery in 1987. When you call or visit you will be assisted by James and Lauris, not sales clerks. That is a combined experience of 60+ years. The Roses have always been active in the orchid world, traveling for shows, sales, or lecturing. Jim's topics will be "The Laelias of Mexico" "and "Orchids of Madagascar".

From 1-35/I-80, take exit #131 (Merle Hay Rd).

Go north on Merle Hay Road for approx 1/2 mile.

Turn west (left) onto Pioneer Pkwy.

Go approx 1 mile. Turn right onto Sunset Lane.

Turn left onto Winwood Dr, then turn left onto Redbud Ct.

### **Directions to Camp Dodge**

From 1-35/I-80, take exit #129 (NW 86th Street).

Go north approximately 2.4 miles to stop sign at NW 70th Avenue.

Turn east (right) onto NW 70th Avenue.

Go approximately 1.2 miles to stoplight. Entrance to Camp Dodge will be to the left.

Enter Camp Dodge on Maintenance Drive.

Turn right on 5th Street.

Turn right on 7th Street.

Rec. Center is on the left, parking is on the right.
