Lauris Rose of Cal-Orchids will be the guest speaker for our June meeting. FALL ORCHID SHOWS MAKE PLANS NOW

Orchid shows take a bit of a hiatus over the summer but they are back in the fall. The list of events on the front page contains just some of the regional ones, the ones we should be participating – if we expect to have other orchid groups at our annual show in the spring.

OSGKC Show September 24 – 25.

First off is the Orchid Society of Greater Kansas City show on March 24 - 2.5at the Loose Park Garden Center in Kansas City. MO. We have received an invitation to participate in their 2016 fall show. OSGKC has been a loyal supporter of our show for vears - even if it meant splitting their resources so they could support other regional shows on the same weekend. Think of it – doing 2 shows on the same weekend. That takes a lot of resources – people and plants. We need to start the planning process now so come September we are ready to hit the road and set up our display. And Kansas City is a great place to visit, and Loose Park is a great park to stroll around, the locals make great use of it.

EIOS Show October 15 – 16.

Nile Dusdieker extended an invitation to their show last year but we had cancel out - no plants in bloom. Nile has been here a number of times, first with EIOS exhibits at our shows and more recently as guest speaker. Cedar Rapids is a bit further than Kansas City but still a relatively easy drive. Participating in their show gives us an opportunity to see how others run a show. And it should be prime time for fall colors - the Grant Wood Scenic Byway is nearby and a great, fun drive.

JUNE ISSUE OF AOS ORCHIDS

The June issue of AOS Orchids is out. "Ouestions and Answers" contains 2 queries about plant problems. One concerns a Cattleva with some problems on the pseudobulbs and leaves. Another is about the "dry rest period" for Dendrobiums. The answers provided are enlightening and helpful. Also the answer on Denbdrobiums mentions a book by Charles and Margaret Baker which is now out-or-print – that book is one of 3 volumes by the writers in our library.

Every wonder about whether those Styrofoam (peanuts and other forms) are harmful or good for your orchids (they're frequently used for drainage material). A Letter to the Editor has some useful

information.

The AOS Conservation Projects article discusses conservation proposals and which ones they selected. One is for the Small White Lady's Slipper (Cypripedium candidum) - which those who made the trip to Columbus, Nebraska area 2 years ago remember. The caption of the photo has an error. It says the range is "westward to Iowa." The conservation committee has been informed (by me) that the range is well into central Nebraska

Summer is here and many orchids will enjoy a bout of fresh air. Tom Mirenda discusses moving them out doors and other cultural concerns.

OUR SPEAKERS

Fred Clarke, Sunset Valley Orchids, CA

Fred Clarke has been growing orchids for over 30 years and has been hybridizing for 25 of those years. With over 25 years as a professional grower and manager in the horticultural industry, Fred applies these skills at his orchid nursery; Sunset Valley Orchids, located in San Diego, CA. He is a passionate orchid grower whose curiosity in orchids is broad and varied. Although developing Cattleya hybrids has been his sustaining interest, he is also actively creating new Bulbophylum and Paphiopedilum hybrids. His pioneering work in Catasetum intergeneric hybrids led to the development of several notable hybrids, most recently the grex, Fredclarkeara After Dark, which produced "the blackest flower ever witnessed". This grex has received nine FCC's, four AM's and the coveted 'Award of Distinction' on the first flowers shown for judging! Fred is an Accredited Judge in the Pacific South Judging Region. His plants have received hundreds of quality awards from the American Orchid Society.

Fred's topics will be "Spotted and Splashed Cattleyas" and "Catasetums and Their Culture"

Hadley Cash, Marriott Orchids, NC

Hadley began growing his first orchids over thirty years ago, and formed Marriott Orchids in 1985. By this time, he had begun growing Paphiopedilums almost exclusively. In the early 1990's, he built his first greenhouse, of approximately 2,500 square feet. Shortly after that, he started a breeding program focused on producing Paphiopedilums of the highest quality. Hadley married his wife Deborah in 1997, and in 1998, just before the birth of their son Austin, he began the orchid business as a full time career. Marriott Orchids expanded its growing area in 1998, to 6,000 square feet of heated greenhouse.

As of early 2015, Hadley has received over 400 American Orchid Society awards, including 15 FCC's (First Class Certificate's). He has had six crosses awarded AQ's (Award of Quality) from the AOS, and won both the W.W.Wilson Award and the Merritt W. Huntington Award (Best Paphiopedilum and Best FCC of the year). In May of 2015, Hadley received the highest distinction of his career... he was awarded the AOS Award for Excellence in Hybridizing. This award is given for a lifelong commitment to hybridizing excellence.

He has written a number of published articles on the genus Paphiopedilum and its hybrids for the AOS, Orchid Digest, and the Slipper Orchid Journal. He has lectured throughout the US and internationally, sharing both his love and expertise of Slipper Orchids.

Hadley's topics will be "Paphiopedilums In General" and "Orchid Rainbows".
